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Easy because $2 \times 6 = 12$ so $4 \times 6 =$ double 2×6 .

Easy because it is 6 less than 60!

Easy because it is only 6 more than 60!

Easy because $4 \times 6 = 24$ and $8 \times 6 = \text{double } 4 \times 6$.



Easy because it is a special number.
It is a square number because a number has been multiplied by itself (6×6)

Easy because it is made of 1x6 (6) and 2x6 (12) . $6+12 = 18$ $(1 \times 6) + (2 \times 6) = 18$

Easy because it is the biggest number but is also made of 6x10 (60) and 6x2 (12)
 $60+12 = 72$
 $(6 \times 10) + (6 \times 2) = 72$
