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Easy because $2 \times 8 = 16$ so $4 \times 8 = \text{double } 2 \times 8$.

Easy because it is 8 less than 80!

Easy because it is only 8 more than 80!

Easy because it is made of 1x6 (6) and 2x6 (12) . $6+12 = 18$ $(1 \times 6) + (2 \times 6) = 18$



Easy because it is a special number.
It is a square number because a number has been multiplied by itself (6×6)

Easy because $3 \times 8 = 24$ and $6 \times 8 = \text{double } 3 \times 8$.



Easy because it is the biggest number but is also made of 6×10 (60) and 6×2 (12)
 $60 + 12 = 72$
 $(6 \times 10) + (6 \times 2) = 72$
